Is your city going digital?

A new ESPON study on the digitalisation of public services in European cities

Dear colleague,

Digital tools and solutions are transforming public services and how governments serve their citizens. A large number of cities have been actively engaging in the modernisation and re-engineering of government processes and services and have seen high returns through simplified governance and increased efficiency, effectiveness and outreach. However, cities face many challenges in the processes of digital transformation including re-thinking governance, allocating resources for re-skilling and adopting new technologies, as well as legislative and policy issues.

ESPON seeks to get a better understanding of the urban dimensions of digital transition in Europe and is therefore launching a Europe-wide survey to gather more evidence. The survey seeks to collect data on the level of digital transition of cities based on the opinions and perceptions of local government authorities and organisations providing public services. The main target groups for the survey are city officials dealing with the provision of public services and ICT.

The closing date for submissions is Friday, the 7th of July 2017. -


The study will allow European, national, regional and urban authorities to better understand the level of digitalisation of public services, to learn from others through benchmarking and to design actions for the future.
